WOW DAY EYFS & KS1






ATTENDANCE

Good attendance means being in school at least 94% of the time or 180-190 days. Did you know? A two week holiday in term time means that the highest attendance you can achieve is 94.5%.

PARKING



When picking up or dropping off children at schools, you should do the following:

- Allow yourself plenty of time as the area is likely to be busy
- Do not park on yellow zigzag lines and avoid parking opposite them

If you park further away, please be considerate of local residents and avoid blocking driveways or accessways. Pick-up and drop-off times are busy outside schools, this can cause an increased safety risk to both children and parents.

Parking restrictions outside schools are there to keep you and your children safe. Parking inconsiderately can put people in danger and you also risk being fined. It's important that motorists follow the <u>Highway Code</u>.

Please note:

The parking spaces in front of the shop, opposite the school, are for shop customers only. There are no disabled parking bays.

The shop owners own the parking spaces in front of the shop and we would ask that our parents refrain from using these spaces during drop off or pick up times unless you are using the shop.

Communication with the school is vitally important and we have a structure in place so we can effectively address any queries or concerns.

If the matter warrants escalation the classteacher will then involve the Key Stage Lead; Mrs Bramwell Key Stage 2 Lead and Mrs Blane EYFS & Key Stage 1 Lead, and then subsequently the Headteacher or Deputy Headteacher if needed. This structure helps the school to address issues in a timely fashion.

Any communication for Mrs Brown must come through the school office. Direct mails are not received to Mrs Brown's inbox. In matters of confidentiality, please mark the email as such and it will be forwarded.

Please send absences and change of pick ups to the absence mailbox or parentmail.


