

Silk screen mesh	Fabric with small holes in used on a frame. A stencil and inks are place on top of the mesh and the ink is pushed through to the paper/ fabric underneath.
Water based printing ink	Ink used to screen print. It produces high-quality prints and has a smooth texture.
Acrylic print- ing medium	Slows the drying time of acrylics, allowing them to be easily washed out of a screen.
Embroidery hoop.	A frame to hold and pull material tight.
stencil	The method of repeating a design through a cut-out shape.
Stippling	A mask is the reverse of a stencil. Rather than being a piece of pa- per, plastic or metal with a design cut out of it, a mask is the piece that has been cut out. Instead of creating a design or pattern it cre- ates a negative image - the reverse of a stencil.
Reproduce	Make more copies.
Hue	A pure colour (colours found on the colour wheel.) This does not include pure black, white and grey.
Tint	A pure colour missed with white (we sometimes call these colours pastels.)
Shade	A pure colour missed with black.
Value	The lightness or darkness of a colour, tint or shade.
Complemen- tary colours	Colours that are 'contrasting' or opposite on the colour wheel. The are daring and make an impact.
Harmonious colours	Colours that are next to each other on the colour wheel. They are harmonious and tranquil.
