On the back of our bikeability sessions this term, we would like to share the below from Claydon Cycling Club in case any of the children are interested.

We will be hosting a 4 week course, starting on the 17th June 2023, for children from the age to 6 to 18 who can already cycle but want to improve their balance and skills. This is to work towards being more confident and possibly taking up competitive cycling.

We will be holding 90 minute training sessions every Saturday at 9am at Steeple Claydon Recreational Ground. These sessions will include learning to slalom cycle, hill climb, limbo and other techniques used in Cyclocross, XC and Mountain biking.

In August there will be a Summer CX event in Milton Keynes that participants can take part in to get a taste of competitive cycling which starts in September

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# Car Seat Safety

Throughout June the police will be focusing on seat belts! Did you know that drivers caught without a seatbelt face on-the-spot fines of £100? If prosecuted, the maximum is £500.

Is your child properly strapped in? Ensure your child's car seat is fitted correctly and is completely secure. Checks have shown that many seats aren't fitted properly – don't let yours be one of them.

You must wear a seat belt if one is fitted in the seat you're using - there are only a few <u>exceptions</u>. You're also only allowed 1 person in each seat fitted with a seat belt.

#### You can be fined up to £500 if you don't wear a seat belt when you're supposed to.

**<u>Children</u>** You must make sure that any children in the vehicle you're driving are:

- in the <u>correct car seat</u> for their height or weight until they reach 135 centimetres tall or their 12th birthday, whichever is first.
- wearing a seat belt if they're 12 or 13 years old, or younger and over 135cm tall.

# You can be fined up to £500 if a child under 14 isn't in the correct car seat or wearing a seat belt while you're driving.
